G. Wayne Clough, Ph.D., P.E.

Secretary Emeritus of the Smithsonian Institution
President Emeritus of the Georgia Institute of Technology

Wayne Clough served as the 10th president of the Georgia Institute of Technology from 1994 to 2008 and as the 12th Secretary of the Smithsonian from 2008 to 2014. A native of Georgia, he earned his BS and MS degrees from Georgia Tech and a PhD from the University of California at Berkeley. He taught at Duke, Stanford, and Virginia Tech, where he served as the Chair of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering and Dean of the College of Engineering. In 1992 he was named Provost at the University of Washington.

Clough was elected to the National Academy of Engineering in 1990 and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in 2010. He was appointed to the National Science Board and the President's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology by President George W. Bush. He has received honorary doctorates from twelve universities.
